- liaise with local consultants and contractors for in-country service delivery, for example delivery of permit related reports.

- have obtained a university degree or higher in business, science, law, policy or engineering
- have solid experience from a related field, e.g. from the wind industry, large scale infrastructure projects, consultancies or from working for authorities or related organizations
- have strong planning and organizational skills and have experience with governmental and authority offshore and coastal permitting and agreement processes in Taiwan
- are willing to work flexibly across a range of tasks and deliverables related to permitting, with a strong ability to balance competing priorities and workstreams
- are fluent in Taiwanese and have strong communication and negotiation skills in Mandarin (with reading and writing proficiency in traditional characters) and English.

You are a dynamic professional with an ability to work independently as well as in teams, and you are focused on finding both constructive and practical solutions to all kinds of challenges. You have excellent communication skills in English and Taiwanese and can communicate smoothly with internal and external stakeholders at all levels.
