Modern Slavery Act 2015: Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement

This statement has been published or made available in accordance with Section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015. It outlines the measures in place at Morecambe Wind Limited to ensure that no slavery or human trafficking is present in our business or our supply chains.

Introduction from the Morecambe Wind Board

Morecambe Wind Limited has a zero-tolerance approach to modern slavery. We are committed to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business dealings and with all our relationships. Through our parent companies, where appropriate we will implement and enforce effective systems and controls to ensure that modern slavery is not taking place anywhere, within the scope of our operation and, to this end, we are committed to ensuring total transparency within the Company and in our approach to tackling modern slavery.

Our Business and Organisation's structure

Morecambe Wind Limited is a joint venture of two world-leading renewable energy companies, Ørsted A/S and Iberdrola, S.A. through their subsidiaries Orsted West of Duddon Sands (UK) Limited and ScottishPower Renewables (WODS) Limited. Morecambe Wind Limited owns the consents and generation licence for the West of Duddon Sands Offshore Windfarm, which is itself jointly owned by Morecambe Wind's parent companies.

Our supply chains and employees.

Morecambe Wind Limited has no immediate supply chain or employees, and therefore consider the risk of Modern Slavery within our immediate operations to be negligible. However in continuing to provide services to West of Duddon Sands Offshore Windfarm, we recognise the implications of slavery and human trafficking for that operation. Both parent companies have assessed the risks of Modern Slavery in relation to West of Duddon Sands Offshore Windfarm within the scope of their own Modern Slavery Act Statements. This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes Morecambe Wind Limited's Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement for the financial year ending 31 December 2022.
